Admission Requirements	 Good academic standing English Language proficiency as ALL modules/classes are taught in English EU - a Level B2 is recommended in accordance with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages USA - GPA score of 2.80 International students from non-English speaking countries require a minimum IELTS score of 6.0 with a minimum of 5.5 in each part of the test. Final approval of admission is at the discretion of Swansea University Academic Advisors. The University reserves the right to deny admission to students who do not meet the requested level.
Module/Course Information, Module Catalogue & Restrictions	 ALL modules in the Colleges of Arts & Humanities; Human & Health Sciences; Science; Medicine and Law are taught entirely on the Singleton Park Campus. ALL modules in the College of Engineering and the School of Management are taught entirely on the Bay Campus If selecting modules taught over both campuses travel time is an important factor to consider. All classes start on the hour and it would not be possible to attend a 10

Examinations & Assessment	 a.m. lecture on the Singleton Park campus followed by an 11 a.m. lecture on the Bay campus as approximately 30 minutes bus/car travel would be involved. Always check the timing & method of assessment of modules as travel time is particularly important during the examination period for those students selecting modules taught over both campuses. Students are advised to select Year 1 (HE level 4) or Year 2 (HE level 5) modules. With the discretion of a department it may be possible to select Year 3 (HE level 6) if students have a sound background in that subject area. Some modules are NOT available to Exchange/Visiting students. 	 Subject areas. Subjects outside of the above MAY offer alternative assessment in Semester 1 (TB1) only. Students are required to meet with the relevant College Office at the beginning of their period of study to discuss if this is an option. Semester 1 students taking alternative assessment by essay do not usually need to be present for examinations but are required to confirm this with their departments. Students assessed by examinations are required to be present for ALL examinations and should not arrange return flights home until their final examination timetable is confirmed by Swansea University Examination Office. Swansea University DOES NOT PROCTOR examinations at any other university.
Transcripts	 From 2017-18 students will be able to access their academic transcripts from their Intranet records. Semester 1 (TB1) students will be able to view Interim transcripts in March each year. Semester 1, Semester 2 & full academic year transcripts will be available at the end of each academic year. Students will be able to download, print or email transcripts directly to their home universities.

Insurance	 EU students – insurance is usually provided through the home university International students – should speak with their Study Abroad Coordinator regarding insurance options. Students entering Swansea University outside of a home university are recommended to take out private insurance
Medical Provision	 EU students will need to obtain a valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) before coming to the UK to access any required medical treatment. International students studying for a full academic year will be able to register with the University Campus Health Centre.

Accommodation & Meals	 International students studying for 6 months or less are unable to register with the University Campus Health Centre. Students are able to attend any local GP/Doctor surgery and pay for a consultation & any medication received. This charge can be reclaimed on health insurance taken out by the student. Students can only apply for accommodation once they have been formally accepted to study at Swansea University. All exchange & visiting students will receive help in finding accommodation from Residential Services. Places are available in University residences as well as University managed flats & houses in the local area.
